The GPL will also help the Washington state Department of Children, Youth, and Families improve their systems connecting families at risk of child abuse and neglect

with quality services and also helping create solutions to improve the transition from teenager to adult for at-risk children. “We ... look forward to collaborating with the Government Performance Lab to help us build systems that will weave together high quality early learning options for the state’s most at-risk young children,” said Secretary Ross Hunter.
